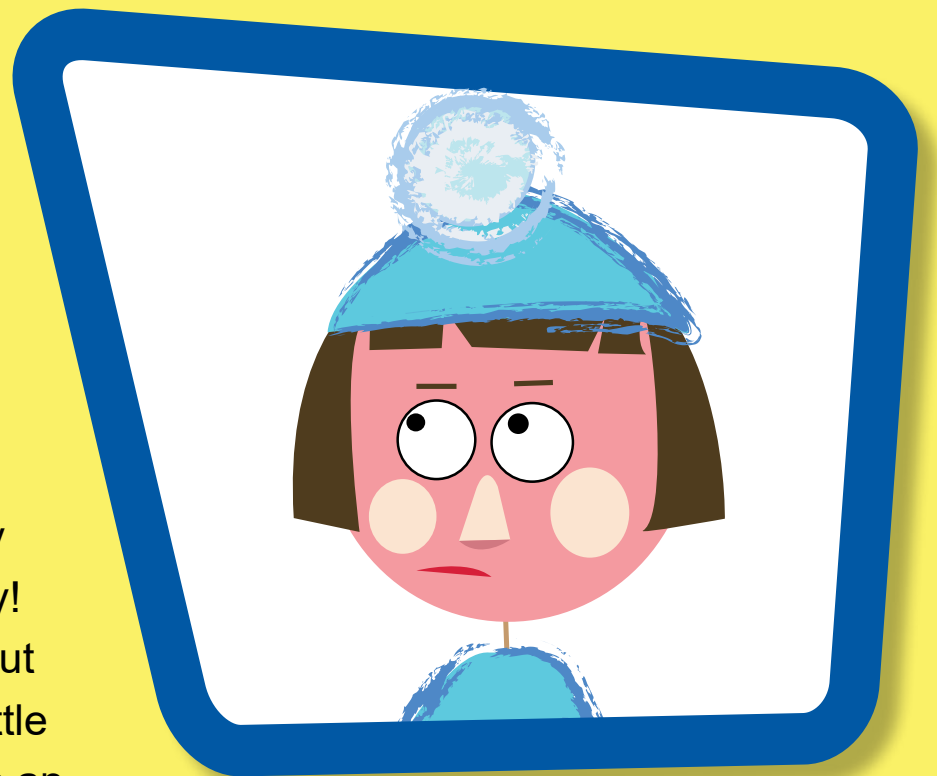
Good Plan Bad Plan
